## London Journal of Energy Style Guidelines

To give your article the highest chance of being selected for print, we ask that you stick to the following guidelines:

- I) **Accessibility:** The article must be accessible to a non-specialist student as well as easy to read.
- II) **Credibility:** The article must be high-quality, accurate and with a list of references which are linked with your article.
- III) **Relevance:** We're the Energy Journal, so the articles should be energy-related. Feel free to push the boundaries and be creative, but remember it always comes back to energy.
- IV) **Length:** Articles must be from 800-2000 words in length (excluding references, titles, captions, etc.). This is a strict word count.
- V) **Referencing:** If necessary, please use Vancouver style referencing with square brackets.
- VI) **Language:** Your article should be written in UK English.
- VII) **Auxiliaries:** The article must include at least one relevant image, diagram and/ or chart. If you cannot find an image, make this clear on your application so we can find an image for you.

Remember that even if your article isn't selected, we will try to put other articles on our website. You can also resubmit for the next deadline.
